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SMITH COUNTY HISTORICAL COMMISSION

BYLAWS DRAFT

Article 1 Authority and Name

1.01 The existence and operation of a County Historical Commission is authorized by the State of Texas under Texas Local Government Code, Chapter 318, as amended.

1.02 The name of the organization shall be the Smith County Historical Commission, hereinafter referred to as the "CHC" or the "Commission."

Article 2 Purpose

2.01 The purpose of the Smith County Historical Commission shall be to advise the Commissioners Court of Smith County, assist the Texas Historical Commission, and to initiate and conduct programs in the promotion of preserving the county's historic and cultural resources.

2.02 The SCHC shall identify, protect, preserve, and interpret the history of Smith County by:

- a. Conducting surveys of historic sites and resources;
- b. Reviewing applications for state historical markers;
- c. Participating in Section 106 Reviews as a Consulting Party for projects that impact cultural resources in Smith County, as defined in the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966.
- d. Commenting on applications for designation at the local, state, and federal levels;
- e. Working with the Texas Historical Commission to plan for long-term preservation goals;
- f. Working with, encouraging, and educating owners of historic properties on the benefits of historic preservation and how to care for their resources;
- g. Documenting the history of the county by written, oral, and other means;
- h. Facilitating the preservation of documents, objects, and other artifacts pertaining to the history of the county;
- i. Encouraging community members to advocate for the preservation of local resources; and
- j. Promoting the public heritage of the county through education and publicity.

The work at the SCHC is not to duplicate the work of other historical preservation efforts in the County, but to supplement and encourage this work through collaboration and cooperation.

Article 3 Powers and Duties of the Commission

3.01 RESOURCE IDENTIFICATION. Pursuant to Section 318.006 of the Texas Local Government Code:

- (a) The Commission shall institute and carry out a continuing historic resource survey of the county to identify the existence and condition of historic buildings, structures, and other historical and archeological sites, private archeological collections, important endangered properties, or other historical features within the county, and shall report the data collected to the Commissioners Court and the Texas Historical Commission.
- (b) The Commission shall develop and maintain a historic resource inventory of surveyed properties and districts in accordance with standards established by the Texas Historical Commission. The inventory shall be known as the Smith County Historic Sites and Structures Inventory (SCHSSI) and should be resurveyed every ten (10) years.
- (c) The Commission shall establish a system for the periodic review and assessment of the condition of designated properties in the county, including Recorded Texas Historic Landmarks, State Antiquities Landmarks, and individual historic properties or districts listed in the National Register of Historic Places. The Commission should report the results of the review and assessment to the Texas Historical Commission as part of its decennial historic resource survey and inventory.

3.02 REPORTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS. Pursuant to Sections 318.008 and 318.0101 of the Texas Local Government Code and in order to inform the Commissioners Court and the Texas Historical Commission of the Commission's needs and programs:

- (a) The Commission shall make an annual report of its activities and recommendations to the Commissioners Court and to the Texas Historical Commission at the start of each calendar year for the previous year. The Commission may make as many other reports and recommendations as it sees fit.
- (b) The Commission shall make recommendations to the Commissioners Court and the Texas Historical Commission concerning the acquisition and designation of property, real or personal, that is of historical, architectural, cultural, or archeological significance.
- (c) The Commission shall work in partnership with other preservation entities to prepare a plan for the preservation of the county's historic and cultural resources. The Commission shall use the Texas Historical Commission's statewide preservation plan for guidance. The preservation plan should be updated every ten (10) years.

3.03 RESOURCE INTERPRETATION. Pursuant to Section 318.010 of the Texas Local Government Code:

(a) The Commission shall review applications for Texas Historical Markers to determine the accuracy, appropriateness, and completeness of the application. All state historical marker

applications submitted during the regular annual application period shall require review and recommendation from the Commission.

- (b) The Commission shall establish a system for the periodic review, assessment, and maintenance of Texas Historical Markers in the county.
- (c) The Commission shall work to promote historic and cultural sites in the county to develop and sustain heritage tourism.

3.04 EDUCATION. Pursuant to Section 318.007 of the Texas Local Government Code, the Commission shall strive to create countywide awareness and appreciation of historic preservation and its benefits and uses. The Commission may partner with schools, museums, universities, and other educational entities to develop and propagate resources for this purpose.

3.05 HISTORIC SITE TAX EXEMPTION. Pursuant to Section 318.012 of the Texas Local Government Code:

- (a) The Commissioners Court may establish a program under which the Commission:
 - (1) receives and reviews applications that are filed with the county and that request a property tax exemption under Section 11.24, Tax Code; and
 - (2) recommends to the Commissioners Court whether to grant the exemption and, if the grant of the exemption is recommended, how much of the property's assessed value should be exempt from taxation. The Commission shall determine the standards and qualifications for such a program.
- (b) The Commission may periodically examine the property that is granted the tax exemption and recommend to the Commissioners Court whether the exemption should be withdrawn in the case of a loss of the property's historic integrity.
- (c) The Commissioners Court shall require a person whose property is granted the tax exemption to notify the HCHC of any plans the person may have to modernize the property or change it in any other manner that would affect its historic integrity.

3.06 CONTRACTS FOR LEASE OR MANAGEMENT OF LANDMARKS. Pursuant to Section 318.013 of the Texas Local Government Code:

(a) The Commissioners Court may, on recommendation from the Commission or other interested persons, contract with a private person or entity for the lease or management of any county-owned real estate, building, structure, or site that is designated by the Texas Historical Commission as a Recorded Texas Historic Landmark, State Antiquities Landmark, or otherwise considered worthy of preservation because of its history, culture, or architecture.

- (b) The contract must be drawn in consultation with the Commission and must specify the duties of the contracting party, including duties as to:
 - (1) maintenance and repairs;
 - (2) providing public access;
 - (3) restricting inappropriate commercial uses; and
 - (4) promoting preservation of the historic, cultural, or architectural aspects of the landmark.
- (c) The contract may be handled in the same manner as a contract for professional services rendered to a county, such as a contract for architectural or engineering services, if the contract is with a nonprofit organization chartered in this state.
- (d) The contract may be for a period of years as determined by the Commissioners Court.

Article 4 Membership

4.01 ELIGIBILITY. Each Commission member shall be an adult resident of Smith County, have an understanding of local history and an interest in the preservation of local historic resources. Non-resident members may be appointed to the Commission if they are employed by a historicor preservation-related entity based in Smith County.

4.02 TERM. Commissioners shall be appointed by the Commissioners Court for two-year terms beginning on January 1 of odd numbered years. The Commissioners Court shall fill a vacancy on the SCHC for the remainder of any unexpired term. Terms may be successive.

- (a) Pursuant to Section 318.004 of the Texas Local Government Code, if the Commissioners Court fails to appoint a Commission by April 1 of each odd numbered year, the Texas Historical Commission may appoint the Commission after thirty (30) days' written notice to the Commissioners Court of its intention to do so. The County Judge shall serve as Commission chair during any interim period.
- (b) Any member may resign by filing a written resignation with the Chair, who shall, in turn, inform the Commissioners Court of such resignation at its next regularly scheduled meeting.
- (c) The Commissioners Court may accept recommendations from the Executive Board to fill any vacancies on the Commission. Appointments will not be official until action is taken by the Commissioners Court at their next regularly scheduled meeting. Any appointments made during a term will only serve until the next regular appointment date.
- 4.03 MEMBERSHIP. The Smith County Historical Commission shall be composed of:
 - (a) At least (7) appointed commissioners, from which at least one (1) shall be appointed from each precinct.

(b) Individuals who broadly reflect the age, ethnic, and geographic diversity of the County.

4.04 CHAIR. The Chair of the Smith County Historical Commission shall be appointed from among its members by the Commissioners Court at the same time regular appointments are made to the Commission.

4.05 EMERITUS. Member Emeritus status may be accorded to any active member who has served at least three (3) terms but can no longer be active because of age, health, or demands of occupation. Emeritus status shall be a non-voting member.

4.06 EX-OFFICIO. Ex-Officio Member status shall include the County Judge and the County Commissioners. Ex-officio status shall be a non-voting member.

4.07 FRIEND OF THE SCHC. Friend of the Smith County Historical Commission status may be granted to any individual who expresses an interest in the historic preservation of Smith County and wishes to play an active role in the SCHC's activities and efforts but does not desire to be appointed to the SCHC by the Commissioners Court or when no vacancy exists. Friend of the SCHC status is a non-voting member.

Article 5 Attendance

5.01 Any member who misses three (3) consecutive regularly scheduled meetings or four (4) regular meetings during their term automatically vacates his or her appointment unless he or she can provide the Executive Board with a legitimate excuse, in which case one or more of the absences may be waived upon a favorable vote by the Commissioners present. Commissioners removed from the Commission due to attendance shall be ineligible for reappointment for at least one term.

5.02 The Secretary shall present an attendance report at each meeting showing attendance by commissioners during that calendar year.

Article 6 Meetings

6.01 REGULAR MEETINGS. Regular meetings shall be held four (4) times each year. The location and time of the meetings shall be determined by the Executive Board.

6.02 SPECIAL MEETINGS. Special meetings may be called by the Chair, two (2) officers of the Executive Board, or at the request of at least three (3) voting members.

6.03 NOTICE OF MEETINGS. In accordance with the Texas Open Meetings Act, notice of any Commission meeting shall be posted 72 hours before the scheduled time of the meeting in a place readily accessible to the general public at all times. Therefore, in addition to notifying each voting member by email, a notice shall be posted at the Smith County Courthouse which shall indicate the date, hour, place and subject of each meeting.

6.04 RECORDS OF OPEN MEETING. The Commission shall prepare and keep minutes or make a recording of each open meeting. Such minutes shall state the subject of each deliberation and shall indicate each vote, order, decision or other action taken. In accordance with the Open Meetings Act, the minutes or tape recordings shall be available for public inspection and copying on requests to the County Judge's Office.

6.05 QUORUM. A quorum shall be a simple majority of the Commission's appointed members, not including non-voting or ex-officio members.

Article 7 Officers

7.01 OFFICERS AND DUTIES. Officers of the Executive Board shall be appointed by the Chair and approved by a majority vote of commissioners present at a meeting no later than the second regularly scheduled meeting of odd-numbered years, except that the Chair shall be appointed by the Commissioners Court.

7.02 EXECUTIVE BOARD. Officers of the Executive Board shall consist of a Chair, Vice-Chair, Secretary, and Treasurer.

- (a) CHAIR. The Chair shall convene all regularly scheduled and special meetings of the Smith County Historical Commission. He or she shall preside over all meetings and have executive supervision over all activities of the SCHC within the scope provided by these Bylaws. The Chair shall report annually on the activities of the Commission to the Commissioners Court, to the membership, and to the Texas Historical Commission, as required. The Chair, or his or her designees, shall act as the principal liaison between the SCHC and other public, private, or governmental entities, as well as the general public. The Chair shall appoint members of committees and shall be an *ex-officio* member of all committees.
- (b) VICE-CHAIR. The Vice Chari shall Perform such duties as the commission, or the chair may direct; and assume the duties of the chair in the event of absence, incapacity or resignation of the chair.
- (c) SECRETARY. The Secretary shall be responsible for keeping records of all Commission meetings and actions, including overseeing the taking of minutes at all SCHC meetings, sending out notices and announcements, distributing copies of minutes and agendas to each member, preparing member attendance reports, and assuring that certified records are maintained. The Secretary shall act as the principal point of contact between the membership and the Executive Board.
- (d) TREASURER. The Treasurer shall be responsible for keeping adequate financial records, for depositing all funds with the County Treasurer, for preparing and recommending a budget and for expending budgeted funds in accordance with the procedures established

by Smith County. The Treasurer shall submit financial reports to the Commissioners Court, as required, and to the membership at each meeting. The Treasurer shall chair the Finance Committee, help develop fundraising plans, and make financial information available to the Commission and the public.

7.03 TERM. Officer terms shall be two (2) years commencing in January of each odd numbered year. Terms may be successive.

7.04 RESIGNATION. Resignation of the Chair must be in writing and received by the County Judge. The Commissioners Court shall appoint a new Chair to complete the current term. Resignation of a Vice-Chair, Secretary, or Treasurer must be in writing and received by the Chair. The Chair shall select a replacement to complete the term, upon favorable vote of the Executive Board and the general membership present.

7.05 HISTORIC PRESERVATION OFFICER. In the event that Smith County becomes a Certified Local Government (CLG), the County Judge shall appoint/hire a Historic Preservation Officer (HPO) that satisfies the Secretary of the Interior's Professional Qualification Standards. The HPO shall be an appointed member of the Commission and in charge of all staff-led preservation efforts in the county. He or she shall ensure that all standards are met to keep the CLG program in good standing with the Texas Historical Commission.

Article 8 Committees

8.01 The Chair shall appoint all committee chairs. Standing committees shall be listed in the section below. The Chair shall also appoint subcommittees and *ad hoc* committees, as needed.

8.02 EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE. The Executive Board shall be composed of the Commission Officers—Chair, Vice-Chair, Secretary, and Treasurer. The Executive Board shall be responsible for overseeing the planning, logistics, and direction of the Commission as a whole, and shall coordinate with all committee chairs to ensure an organized and harmonious SCHC.

(a) In the event that Smith County becomes a Certified Local Government, the Executive Committee shall also act as the CLG Committee, with the Historic Preservation Officer serving as chair of that committee. The CLG Committee would then be required to meet at least six (6) times per year, complete the CLG Annual Report, and submit the report and all meeting minutes to the Texas Historical Commission.

8.03 HISTORIC RESOURCES COMMITTEE. The Historic Resources Committee shall be responsible for developing a county-wide historic resource inventory composed of properties that have the achieved the following designations: Recorded Texas Historic Landmark, National Register of Historic Places, State Antiquities Landmark, and Subject Marker signs. This document shall be referred to as the Smith County Historic Sites and Structures Inventory (SCHSSI)

(a) The Historic Resources Committee will update the SCHSSI annually.

(b) The Historic Resources Committee will establish a system for periodic review, assessment, and maintenance of all Official Texas Historical Markers (Subject Markers and Recorded Texas Historic Landmarks) within the county boundaries.

8.04 SUBJECT MARKER COMMITTEE. The Subject Marker Committee shall conduct research on significant local buildings, structures, sites, people, and events that have contributed to the history and development of Smith County, and shall nominate appropriate resources and subjects for designation with historical markers at the appropriate levels. The Committee shall also:

- (a) Help people interested in obtaining a marker through the application process.
- (b) Review all marker applications for accuracy and completeness before submitting them to the Texas Historical Commission.

8.05 FINANCE COMMITTEE. The Finance Committee is responsible for all matters relating to the Commission's fiscal responsibilities and shall be chaired by the Treasurer. The Committee shall follow all Smith County government procedures in management of the budget. The Finance Committee shall create a working budget for each year's activities for submission to the Commissioners' Court.

8.06 CEMETERY COMMITTEE. The Cemetery Committee shall oversee all efforts related to the identification, documentation, preservation, maintenance, and beautification of all cemeteries in Smith County. The Committee shall work with public and private entities to plan, encourage, and facilitate the proper care of the county's cemeteries.

8.07 OUTREACH & PUBLICITY COMMITTEE. The Outreach & Publicity Committee shall be responsible for publicizing all SCHC events and activities beyond the notification requirements. This may include the use of email, newsletters, social media, and press releases. The Committee shall ensure that the citizens of Smith County are aware of the Commission's work and contributions to the preservation of the county's history and resources.

Article 9 Financial Administration

9.01 FISCAL AND HUMAN RESOURCES. Pursuant to Section 318.009 of the Texas Local Government Code, the Commissioners Court may pay the necessary expenses of the Commission.

- (a) The Commissioners Court may make agreements with governmental agencies or private organizations and may appropriate funds from the general fund of the county for the purpose of:
 - (1) erecting historical markers and monuments;
 - (2) purchasing objects and collections of objects that are historically significant to the county;
 - (3) preparing, publishing, and disseminating, by sale or otherwise, a history of the county;

- (4) hiring professional staff and consultants;
- (5) providing matching funds for grants; and
- (6) funding other programs or activities as suggested by the Texas Historical Commission and the Commissioners Court.
- (b) The Texas Historical Commission may make grants available to the Commission, subject to the budgetary authority and approval of the Commissioners Court, to carry out the purposes of this chapter.

9.02 BUDGET. The Finance Committee, under the direction of the Treasurer, shall prepare a list of anticipated expenditures for the ensuing year, but the final budget shall be prepared by the Commissioners Court.

9.03 RECEIPT OF GIFTS. The Commission shall be authorized to accept gifts of money and property, including real property, to further its historical preservation goals and for any use in the of its lawful purpose consistent with the Texas Historical Commission and Smith County's stated policies. All gifts will be acknowledged in a regular meeting of the Commissioners Court and monetary gifts will be deposited into the general fund of Smith County.

Article 10 Parliamentary Procedure

10.01 PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE. *Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised* (latest edition), shall be the authoritative reference for all procedures not covered by these Bylaws.

Article 11 Amendments

11.01 These Bylaws may be amended by the Executive Board, subject to ratification by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the qualified members present at a regularly scheduled Commission meeting, provided the amendment has been submitted in writing to the full membership at least two (2) weeks before the meeting at which the vote on the amendment is taken. The Bylaws will then be presented to the Commissioners Court for final approval at their next regularly scheduled meeting.

Motion to approve minutes made by Mr. Sabota, second by Mr. Wade. Minutes were approved as presented.

Officer Reports:

Vice Chairman Mr. McMakin reported on the Smith County Historic Sites and Structures Inventory (SCHSSI) data base development and that a data base created by Randy Gilbert will be utilized. The SCHSSI needs to incorporate Todd's TxDOT resources. It was decided to postpone consideration until both data bases can be combined.

Treasurer Mr. Bailiff reported that there are no funds as of this time and unsure how funding will be done—lump sum or through the county. Questions were raised about how the Commission finances will be facilitated and if the Commission will have its own bank account. Mr. Herterich asked Mr. Bailiff to figure these issues out.

Committee Reports:

Historical Resources: Mr. McMakin is continuing work on the Historic Sites inventory.

Subject Marker: Mr. Thacker reported that an on line portal exists to apply for markers. No applications have been submitted at this time. Information is available on the Smith County web site.

Cemetery: Mr. Wade reported that he now has a list of all cemeteries in Smith County and will provide them to Mr. Herterich.

Camp Ford: Thursday County Judge Franklin and a group will meet at the Camp Ford site to survey the area and discuss the needs to include safety issues. Mr. McCall pointed out that the East Texas Heritage Museum Association owns some of the property across Highway 271 from Camp Ford where the Head Quarters of the post was located. Mr. Sabota agreed to contact Dr. Edwards to establish a line of communications.

Old Business:

Mr. Herterich presented the bylaws, having made three minor changes. Mr. Turner made a motion to adopt the bylaws, second by Mr. Bailiff. Motion carried (Bylaws attached).

Mr. Wade presented a catalog of all museums in East Texas. Mr. Herterich suggested that he send a list of organizations in Smith County to the Commission who could review and suggest edits for a master list. Mr. Wade also suggested that a date be picked to meet with all the organizations in Smith County. Mr. Bailiff reported that he had made a presentation at the Lindale City Council, Mr. McMakin reported that he had unsuccessfully tried to speak to the Whitehouse council. Mr. Turner reported that he planned to attend the Bullard City Council meeting tonight.

New Business:

Mr. Bailiff presented a Budget Application outlining the projected financial needs of the Commission (Budget Application attached). After discussion it was decided that the funds requested for three members of the Commission to attend the Real Places Conference of the Texas Historical Commission should be itemized and that funds for the placement of historical markers should be reduced to one large marker. Also it was suggested that some consideration be given to some funding for one annual event.

Mr. McMakin reported that the county has a GIS team and they will work with us to develop the Smith County Historic Sites Atlas as part of the Smith County Historical Commission web site.

Mr. Wade made a motion to accept Ms. Dorothy Franks as a candidate to be presented to the Commissioner Court to be a member of the Smith County Historical Commission, second by Mr. Turner. Motion carried.
