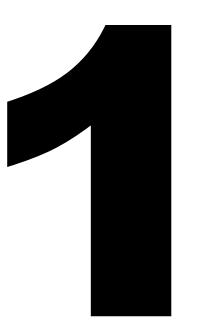

At a regular meeting of the Smith County Commissioners Court held at the Smith County Courthouse Annex,

Tyler, Texas, at which a quorum was present, the following Resolution was adopted

WHEREAS, Bishop Lawrence L. Reddick III, the 51st Bishop elected in the Christian Methodist Episcopal Church, has served as Presiding Bishop of the Eighth Episcopal District since July 2014, and was elevated to Senior Bishop — the denomination's longest-serving active Bishop and CEO — in that same year; and

WHEREAS born on June 20, 1952, in Huntsville, Alabama, Bishop Reddick is one of seven children. He is an accomplished scholar who earned a bachelor's degree from Ohio Wesleyan University and a Master of Divinity Degree from Duke Divinity School, with honorary doctorates conferred by United Theological Seminary and Texas College. His journey into ordained ministry began at the age of 14, when he was licensed to preach at Frazier Chapel C.M.E Church in Athens, Alabama. He was ordained Deacon in 1968, Elder in 1969, and admitted into full connection in 1972; and

WHEREAS, before he was elected Bishop in 1998, he served congregations and communities across Alabama, Ohio, North Carolina, Missouri and Mississippi. His Episcopal assignments have spanned the United States and the globe; and

WHEREAS, Bishop Reddick served as Chair of the Texas College Trustee Board, and serves on the Board of Directors of Bread for the World.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Commissioners Court of the County of Smith, Texas, through adoption of this Resolution does hereby proclaim July 17, 2025, as

"Senior Bishop Lawrence L. Reddick III Day"

in Smith County, and encourages all citizens to congratulate him on his legacy, which continues to impact the C.M.E. Church and the community.

The Smith County 9-1-1 Communications District is pleased to submit the Proposed FY 2025-2026. District Operating Budget for consideration by the Smith County Commissioners' Court. It was reviewed and approved for submittal by the District Board of Managers on June 25, 2025. As per the Health & Safety Code 772, the budget must now be submitted to the Smith County Commissioners Court and the municipalities within the district for their review and comments regarding the budget.

The proposed FY 2025-2026 budget has been split into two different budgets. The 911 Budget (pages 1-11) is subject to the review process as per Health and Safety Code Section 772. The 911 Budget provides a detailed line-item breakdown of anticipated income and expenses for the upcoming fiscal year. This budget is related directly to the delivery of the 911 call and management of the 911 network. The SC 911 District continues our commitment to working in partnership and supporting Smith County Sheriff's Office and Fire Marshalls Office with the following items include in this year's budget:

- \$763,981.00 in upgrades to hardware/software/network at all dispatch call-taking positions at the SCSO Dispatch Center.
- \$125,000 in funding specifically for SCEOC PSAP Project Participation funding to support and improve dispatch services and facilities.
- \$23,000 in shared funding for training, pre-employment testing, and support of dispatch staff.

The GIS Consortium budget (pages 12-14) provides the detailed income/expenses for the GIS Consortium (SC911 District, City of Tyler, SCAD, and Smith County). SC911 District serves as the liaison for the GIS Consortium by inter-local agreement with each agency, and is, by agreement, the agency responsible for providing administrative support for the Consortium. The GIS Consortium is responsible for the management and update to the county wide aerial photography and other GIS data used by both the agencies and citizens. This budget includes funds entrusted to the District by the other members of the consortium, but those funds are not available to meet general SC911 District expenses. It is being provided for your information as part of our overall operation.

The district requests that you review the Smith County 9-1-1 Communications District Proposed Fiscal Year 2025-2026. Budget and place it on the Commissioners Court agenda for approval by September 25, 2025. I am available to attend the meeting to answer any questions regarding the budget. OFFSITE EVENTS:

Spouses' activities will be held offsite on Wednesday and possibly Tuesday. An off property dinner and event is scheduled for Tuesday evening (host court night). Leisure activities are scheduled for Wednesday afternoon.

HOST COURT INVOLVEMENT:

The host county court for the North & East Texas County Judges and Commissioners Association assumes a tremendous responsibility in assisting the Association with many aspects of the conference. Traditionally, the host county sponsors an evening function known as Host Court Night. This is listed as part of the conference entertainment and is the financial responsibility of the Host Court. This event should be planned and coordinated with other events to avoid conflicting menus, themes and location. A resolution of support from the hosting Commissioners Court must be included in the response to this RFP.

PROPOSAL REQUIREMENTS/REQUESTED CONCESSIONS:

These are items we would like to see in the contract for the 2027 conference:

- 1 per 40 comps.
- Reduced audio/visual pricing that will be included in the contract. We will use screens and AV carts for most rooms.
- Ability to bring own audio/visual equipment. This will include, but not limited to, projectors, mixers and microphones.
- Upgrade options for presidential suite/junior suites. We have five association officers that will be staying throughout the conference and four VIPs that we also generally house in an upgraded room.
- Complimentary sleeping rooms and one complimentary meeting room to accommodate 10-12 people for at least one planning meeting (prefer two planning meetings).
- Option for group rates to be offered three days before/after meeting dates for those in the room block.
- Menu pricing set one year prior to conference.
- An allowance for one food break to be brought in by the Texas Extension Service.
- Room block cutoff date two (2) weeks prior to conference.
- 20% guest room attrition.
- 72-hour F&B guarantees.
- Complimentary water stations in all meeting rooms.
- Complimentary meeting room rental based on 75% group room pickup.
- Maximum of \$2,000 rental for exhibit hall space. This would be a one-time fee and include the setup day and both exhibiting days. No other room rental charges, table or chair rental fees, electrical hook up or internet access fees would be charged.
- Complimentary internet access throughout the hotel for attendees. This would include the banquet hall, meeting rooms, sleeping rooms and lobby areas.
- Complimentary shuttle service to/from airport.
- Complimentary parking for all attendees.
- A review and opt-out clause if renovation work is undertaken by the property/properties that will have an unreasonable effect on the conference outcome.
- No additional charges outside of contracted charges unless an addendum is signed. This would include any additional charges that are created by the property that were not negotiated at the time of the contract signing. Examples would include new charges for internet access, electrical access, water break charges, AV company charges, storage room charges.

Key Criteria for Consideration:

Officers look for locations that have meeting space in-house or adjacent to the hotel. Prefer all attendees to stay in one hotel. If overflow hotels are needed, they should be in short walking distance to host hotel and meeting space.
