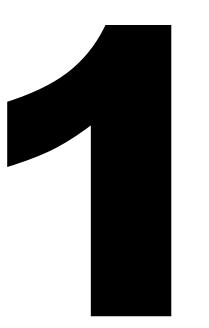

AMENDED BENEFICIARY AGREEMENT BETWEEN SMITH COUNTY AND THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS HEALTH SCIENCE CENTER AT TYLER FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF ARPA FUNDS

This <u>AMENDED</u> AGREEMENT is made, entered into, and executed by and between Smith County, Texas, a political subdivision of the State of Texas, referred to as "County," and The University of Texas Health Science Center at Tyler, an educational agency of the State of Texas and a health-related institution of The University of Texas System ("UTHSCT").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2021, the American Rescue Plan Act (H.R. 1319), § 4001, ("ARPA") was signed into law providing federal funding relief for American workers, families, industries, and state and local governments;

WHEREAS, on May 10, 2021, the United States Department of Treasury released an interim final guide on allowed uses of funds and allocated \$350 billion for state, local, territorial, and Tribal governments from the American Rescue Plan Act Fund;

WHEREAS, Smith County was allocated \$45,209,153.00 in ARPA funds, and received half of this amount in 2021 and the other half in 2022;

WHEREAS, UTHSCT, its employees and patients have been and continue to be on the front line of the Covid-19 pandemic. Since and due to the pandemic, UTHSCT's ability to provide behavioral health services in Smith County has been adversely affected while the number of individuals in need of such services has increased;

WHEREAS, UTHSCT did not receive ARPA funds and needs additional funds to provide and expand behavioral health services in Smith County. Specifically, UTHSCT intends to rehabilitate the former behavioral health center at 4101 University Boulevard, Tyler, Texas 75701, as a fully licensed behavioral health hospital with expanded inpatient capacity as well as a facility to provide intensive outpatient programs, expand existing behavioral health hospital located at 11937 U.S. Hwy 271, Tyler, TX 75708 to include inpatient behavioral health beds dedicated to Smith County resident or any patient admitted to UTHSCT;

WHEREAS, UTHSCT is a state agency qualified to receive ARPA grants; and

WHEREAS, County has determined that UTHSCT is an appropriate beneficiary to receive a grant of ARPA funds:

WHEREAS, On September 24, 2024 Smith County and UTHSCT entered into a Beneficiary Agreement for the Distribution of ARPA Funds; and

NOW, THEREFORE, County and UTHSCT, in consideration of these mutual covenants and agreements, agree as follows:

- 1. The purpose of this agreement is to enable County to provide a portion of its ARPA funding to UTHSCT as a beneficiary to enable UTHSCT, together with other non-County financing and resources, to rehabilitate the former behavioral health center at 4101 University Boulevard, Tyler, Texas 75701, as a fully licensed behavioral health hospital with expanded inpatient capacity as well as a facility to provide intensive outpatient programs, expand existing behavioral health hospital located at 11937 U.S. Hwy 271, Tyler, TX 75708 to include inpatient behavioral health beds dedicated to Smith County resident or any patient admitted to UTHSCT. This agreement is not intended to provide ARPA funding for any purposes that are not allowable under Texas law.
- **2.** UTHSCT agrees that all funds received from County pursuant to this agreement shall be used for the purposes stated in paragraph 1.
- **3.** While UTHSCT will contract with others to perform work for which funds will be used, UTHSCT will be solely responsible to County under this agreement for funds expended and work performed using such funds.
- 4. County agrees to provide UTHSCT with \$4,000,000.00. It is the intent of the parties that these funds will be used within in accordance with the terms of this Beneficiary Agreement and ARPA and SLFRF Guidelines as set forth by the US Department of Treasury. one year from the effective date of this agreement. If any portion of the funds has not been used within one year from the effective date, UTHSCT will return the unused funds to County unless UTHSCT requests and receives an extension of time. One hundred percent (100%) of the funds will be provided to UTHSCT within two weeks after approval of this agreement by the parties.
- **5.** The amount provided pursuant to this agreement does not obligate County to provide additional funds to UTHSCT for these or any other purposes in the future.
- **6.** In order to ensure compliance with the existing ARPA and SLFRF (Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds program) guidelines set forth by the US Treasury, while also ensuring that all expenditures within the scope of this Agreement adhere to future guidelines that may be established by the US Treasury during the term of this Agreement, UTHSCT shall provide any additional documentation to support such expenditures requested by the Smith County Auditor upon request.
- 7. UTHSCT shall provide County monthly progress reports documenting the project progress. UTHSCT shall provide to the Smith County Auditor any invoices for work performed, goods and services, copies of cleared checks for payment of invoices, photographs, plans, designs, or any other documentation as deemed necessary by the Smith County Auditor to show the projects progress. UTHSCT shall provide the requested documentation on or before the last business day of each successive month after the effective date of this agreement. County may request additional information from UTHSCT, as needed, to meet any additional guidelines regarding the use of ARPA funds that may be established by the US Treasury.

- **8.** UTHSCT shall comply with all federal, state, and local laws and all requirements and published guidance set forth regarding the usage of any and all monies appropriated under the ARPA. The parties agree that County reserves the right to hire or consult with a third party for compliance with all state, federal, and local laws regarding the usage of ARPA funds. UTHSCT agrees to cooperate with any request for information, documentation, or other necessary actions to ensure ARPA compliance from either Smith County, its contractors, or employees.
- **9.** UTHSCT shall maintain records, books, documents, and other materials relevant to its performance under this Agreement. These records shall be subject to inspection, review, and audit by County or its designees, and the US Treasury for five (5) years following termination of this Agreement. If it is determined during the course of the audit that UTHSCT was reimbursed for unallowable costs under this Agreement, UTHSCT agrees to promptly reimburse County for such payments upon request
- **10.** UTHSCT agrees to comply with any reporting obligations established by Treasury as they relate to this grant.
- 11. If UTHSCT uses any portion of the funds provided under this agreement for any purposes not directly related to the intended purpose of this agreement or uses the funds for a purpose not allowed by Texas law, County shall have the right to require a return of all or any portion of the funds so provided. If UTHSCT fails to provide any report required by this agreement or fails to provide any other documents requested by a Smith County official pursuant to this agreement, County shall have the right to require a return of all or any portion of the funds so provided.
- 12. At no times while operating under this Agreement will any officers, employees, or volunteers of either entity be considered employees or agents of the other entity.
- 13. It is expressly understood and agreed that no provision of this agreement is in any way intended to constitute a waiver by either party of any immunity from suit or liability that the parties or any of their officers and employees may have by operation of law.
- 14. This agreement shall be construed to effectuate the purpose stated in Section I. If any provision of this agreement is declared unconstitutional, or the applicability to any persons or circumstances is held invalid, the constitutionality of the remainder of the agreement and applicability to the other persons and circumstances shall not be affected.
- 15. The parties to this agreement do not intend to create a third-party beneficiary or for any third party to obtain a right by virtue of this Agreement. Neither this agreement, nor any term or provision hereof, nor any inclusion by reference, shall be construed as being for the benefit of any party not in signatory hereto.
- **16.** The parties shall observe and comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules, ordinances, and regulations in any manner affecting this agreement.

17. It is mutually understood that nothing in this Agreement is intended or shall be construed in any way creating or establishing the relationship of partners between the parties hereto, or as constituting either party as an agent or representative of the other party for any purpose or in any manner whatsoever.

18. INDEMNIFICATION: THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ARTICLE SHALL SURVIVE THE TERMINATION OF THIS AMENDED AGREEMENT HOWEVER CAUSED, AND NO PAYMENT, PARTIAL PAYMENT, OR ISSUANCE OF EITHER A CERTIFICATE OF SUBSTANTIAL COMPLETION OR FINAL SYSTEM ACCEPTANCE IN WHOLE OR IN PART SHALL WAIVE OR RELEASE ANY OF THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ARTICLE.

TO THE EXTENT ALLOWED UNDER TEXAS LAW, UTHSCT SHALL INDEMNIFY, DEFEND, AND HOLD HARMLESS COUNTY ITS OFFICERS, DIRECTORS, AGENTS, EMPLOYEES, SUCCESSORS, AND ASSIGNS ("INDEMNIFIED PARTIES") FROM AND AGAINST ALL CLAIMS AND LIABILITY DUE TO THE ACTIVITIES OF CONTRACTOR, OR ANOTHER ENTITY OVER WHICH UTHSCT EXERCISES CONTROL, PERFORMED UNDER THIS AMENDED AGREEMENT AND WHICH RESULT FROM ANY NEGLIGENT ACT, ERROR, OR OMISSION; INTENTIONAL TORT; INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY INFRINGEMENT; OR FAILURE TO PAY A CONTRACTOR OR SUPPLIER; COMMITTED BY UTHSCT OR ANOTHER ENTITY OVER WHICH UTHSCT EXERCISES CONTROL.

TO THE EXTENT ALLOWED UNDER TEXAS LAW, UTHSCT SHALL ALSO INDEMNIFY, DEFEND, AND HOLD HARMLESS COUNTY FROM AND AGAINST ANY AND ALL EXPENSES, INCLUDING REASONABLE ATTORNEY'S FEES WHICH MIGHT BE INCURRED BY COUNTY, IN LITIGATION OR OTHERWISE RESISTING SAID CLAIMS OR LIABILITIES WHICH MIGHT BE IMPOSED ON COUNTY AS THE RESULT OF SUCH ACTIVITIES BY UTHSCT OR ANOTHER ENTITY OVER WHICH UTHSCT EXERCISES CONTROL.

TO THE EXTENT ALLOWED UNDER TEXAS LAW, UTHSCT SHALL INDEMNIFY, DEFEND, AND HOLD COUNTY HARMLESS FROM ANY AND ALL LIABILITY, EXPENSE, JUDGMENT, SUIT, CAUSE OF ACTION, OR DEMAND FOR PERSONAL INJURY, DEATH, OR DIRECT DAMAGE TO TANGIBLE PROPERTY WHICH MAY ACCRUE AGAINST COUNTY TO THE EXTENT IT IS CAUSED BY THE NEGLIGENCE OF UTHSCT OR ANOTHER ENTITY OVER WHICH UTHSCT EXERCISES CONTROL, WHILE PERFORMING SERVICES UNDER THIS AMENDED AGREEMENT. COUNTY WILL GIVE UTHSCT PROMPT, WRITTEN NOTICE OF ANY SUCH CLAIM OR SUIT. COUNTY SHALL COOPERATE WITH UTHSCT IN ITS DEFENSE OR SETTLEMENT OF SUCH CLAIM OR SUIT.

TO THE EXTENT ALLOWED UNDER TEXAS LAW, UTHSCT SHALL INDEMNIFY, DEFEND, AND HOLD HARMLESS COUNTY FROM AND ALL THIRD-PARTY CLAIMS, DAMAGES, LIABILITIES, AND EXPENSES (INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITATION ATTORNEY'S FEES) FOR INURY TO OR DEATH OF ANY

PERSON OR FOR DAMAGE TO OR DESTRUCTION OF ANY THIRD PARTY PROPERTY RESULTING DIRECTLY FROM ANY AND ALL ACTS OR OMISSIONS OF UTHSCT, ANY CONTRACTOR, OR ANYONE EMPLOYED BY OR AFFILIATED WITH ANY OF THEM OR ANYONE FOR WHOSE ACTS ANY OF THEM MAY BE LIABLE, PROVIDED THAT, FOR PURPOSES OF THIS PARAGRAPH, THE TERM "THIRD PARTY" SHALL INCLUDE CONTRACTOR'S OFFICERS, AGENTS, CONTRACTORS, AND EMPLOYEES.

TO THE EXTENT ALLOWED UNDER TEXAS LAW, UTHSCT SHALL ALSO INDEMNIFY, DEFEND, AND HOLD HARMLESS COUNTY FROM ALL DAMAGES, EXPENSES, SUITS, ACTIONS AND CLAIMS OF EVERY KIND AND CHARACTER WHATSOEVER WHICH COUNTY MAY SUFFER DIRECTLY DUE TO ANY BANKRUPTCY, STATE OR FEDERAL TAX LEVIES OR LIENS, OR OTHER SIMILAR LEGAL PROCEEDINGS AFFECTING THE CONTRACTOR, IN WHICH COUNTY MAY BECOME IN ANY WAY INVOLVED, WHETHER RELATED TO THE AMENDED AGREEMENT AND/OR CONTRACTOR'S PERFORMANCE OR NON-PERFROMANCE UNDER THIS AMENDED AGREEMENT.

IF A RESTRAINING ORDER OR TEMPORARY INJUNCTION IS GRANTED DUE TO ANY ACT, ERROR, OR OMISSION COMMITTED BY UTHSCT OR ANOTHER ENTITY OVER WHICH UTHSCT EXERCISES CONTROL, UTHSCT SHALL MAKE EVERY EFFORT TO OBTAIN THE SUSPENSION OF ANY SUCH RESTRAINING ORDER OR TEMPORARY INJUNCTION. COUNTY RESERVES THE RIGHT, AT ITS OWN EXPENSE, TO BE INDEPENDENTLY REPRESENTED BY COUNSEL OF ITS OWN CHOICE IN CONNECTION WITH ANY SUCH SUIT OR PROCEEDING.

- 19. The exclusive venue for any action under or related to this Beneficiary Agreement is in a state or federal court of competent jurisdiction in Tyler, Smith County, Texas
- 20. This instrument constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes any and all agreements previously entered into by these same parties pertaining to the activities covered by this agreement

CONTRACT FOR PUBLIC SERVICES BETWEEN SMITH COUNTY, TEXAS AND KURT NOELL (FY 2026)

THIS CONTRACT entered into beginning effective on the ____ day of October, 2025, by and between Smith County, a political subdivision of the State of Texas acting through her governing body, hereinafter referred to as ("COUNTY"), and the Kurt Noell, an attorney licensed to practice law in the State of Texas, hereinafter referred to as ("ATTORNEY").

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the COUNTY has an interest in supporting the efficient and effective administration of the legal system in local courts and through the County Law Library for services to and support of the legal community and the public-at-large;

WHEREAS, the COUNTY has an interest in supporting the Courts efforts to assist self-represented litigants in divorce proceedings filed in Smith County;

WHEREAS, all Smith County Courts requires all self-represented litigants to attend the Smith County Self-Represented Litigant Clinic taught by a licensed attorney who regularly practices in Smith County, prior to a final divorce hearing; and

WHEREAS, this agreement in the best interest of the public.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PARTIES agree as follows:

1. Public Services Rendered by Clinic Attorney Acting As An Independent

<u>Contractor</u>. The essential position responsibilities of the ATTORNEY are outlined in a document marked as "Exhibit A" and is incorporated herein as if copied in full. The ATTORNEY may use the compensation paid hereunder to perform the services and achieve the broad goals outlined in this agreement.

2. <u>Reports/Payment</u>. ATTORNEY shall provide to COUNTY with quarterly and annual financial reports in a form agreed upon by COUNTY and ATTORNEY relating to the activities outlined in Exhibit A. ATTORNEY agrees to cooperate with inspections and audits that COUNTY may make to ensure service standards and fiscal responsibility.

In return for these services and as its part of the cost, COUNTY agrees to pay to the ATTORNEY a **yearly amount of \$16,200.00**, **payable in monthly installments of \$1,350.00**. All installments will be payable on the first of each month or reasonably thereafter.

Despite this agreed upon method of payment, the ATTORNEY agrees to return to COUNTY the prorated monthly amount of funds unearned if the ATTORNEY'S services are terminated for any reason prior to **September 30, 2026.** ATTORNEY'S prorated repayment will be due to COUNTY the first day of the month after ATTORNEY'S service terminates and be made, in full, in one (1) payment.

- **3.** Records. The ATTORNEY shall keep sufficient records of all of its activities in connection with services rendered pursuant to this contract and COUNTY shall have the right to inspect such records at all reasonable times.
- **4.** <u>Independent Contractor/Indemnity</u>. It is understood and agreed that ATORNEY is not and shall not in any sense be considered an employee, partner or joint venturer with COUNTY, additionally neither shall ATTORNEY be considered or in any manner hold itself out as an agent or official representative of COUNTY. ATTORNEY shall be considered an independent contractor for purposes of this agreement and shall in no manner incur any expenses or liability on behalf of the COUNTY.

ATTORNEY further agrees to hold COUNTY harmless for any and all claims by third parties for any injuries, damages, or liability of any kind arising under or occasioned by ATTORNEY.

5. <u>Compliance With All Laws.</u> COUNTY and ATTORNEY each agree, in connection with the services or any related items to the subject matter of this contract, to comply with any and all local, state or federal requirements.

6. <u>Notice</u>. Any notice required to be given under the terms of this agreement shall be effective if and when given in writing and mailed by certified mail to the addresses listed below or subsequently provided in writing:

- 7. No Assignment. This contract may not be assigned.
- **8.** <u>Termination</u>. Notwithstanding the agreed upon term, this agreement may be terminated upon the occurrence of any of the following:
 - a. the termination of the corporate existence of ATTORNEY or failure to maintain State of Texas Law License;
 - b. the insolvency of ATTORNEY, the filing of a petition in bankruptcy either by or against ATTORNEY, or an assignment by ATTORNEY for the benefit of creditors;
 - c. the breach by ATTORNEY of any of the terms of this agreement and the continuation of such breach for a period of ten (10) days after written notice is given by COUNTY to ATTORNEY of such breach.
 - d. upon COUNTY's sole discretion with or without cause by providing thirty (30) days written notice.
- 9. <u>Term</u>. The term of this agreement shall be for a one (1) year period beginning effective on October 1, 2025, through September 30, 2026.
- 10. <u>Employees</u>. The parties covenant and agree that each party will pay its own salaries, and all Social Security taxes, Federal and State Unemployment Insurance, Worker's Compensation Insurance and any similar taxes or expenses related to its own employees, including, but not limited to, license fees, insurance premiums and outfitting

expenses. The Parties shall be responsible for complying with all Federal, State and Local laws, ordinances and regulations regarding its own employees.

- 11. Continued Adequate Funding. ATTORNEY expressly understand that the attorney position is completely dependant on continued adequate funding. If COUNTY funding or any anticipated grant funding is deemed by any of the parties to be inadequate, the agreement may be terminated pursuant to the provisions in paragraphs 2 and 8 above.
- 12. Venue & Applicable Law. Venue of this contract shall be Smith County, Texas, and the laws of the State of Texas shall govern all terms and conditions.
- 13. Severability. In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this agreement shall for any reason be held to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision in this agreement and this agreement shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained in it
- 14. Mediation. The parties agree to use mediation for dispute resolution prior to and formal legal action being taken on this agreement.

EXHIBIT A

The Essential Position Responsibilities of the CLINIC ATTORNEY

- In these classes, the Clinic Attorney will explain to attendees the requirements for an uncontested divorce and Final Divorce Decree with and without children. He/she will also instruct attendees on court procedures and rules for specific courts. Attendees may be given general legal information, but will be instructed to contact an attorney if they have specific questions that would require legal advice. Attendees will be informed that they should seek legal advice from an attorney if the forms do not adequately complete their case. There will be a question and answer period at the end of each class.
- The attorney will conduct these classes for 1 ½ 2 hours once per week at prescheduled times.
- The attorney will schedule classes at least ninety (90) days ahead of time, and inform the law library of these dates.
- If classes must be rescheduled or cancelled, the attorney must notify the law library as soon as possible.
- The attorney must record at least one class session to use as a backup in case of class cancellations.
- The attorney will collect information regarding each attendee's name and cause number and provide that information to the District Clerk's office in a timely manner, so that pro se litigants can schedule final divorce hearings.



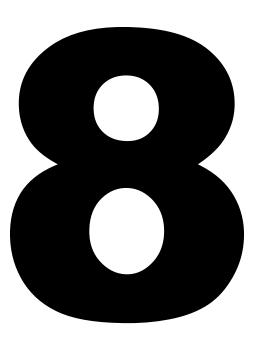


- 5. No lines are to be installed under or within 50 ft. of either end of a bridge. No lines shall be placed in a culvert or within 10 ft. of the closest point of same.


