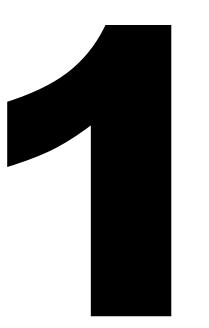

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COUNTY OF SMITH

ORDER AUTHORIZING SMITH COUNTY'S COLLECTION OF A MANDATORY PAYMENT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2026

WHEREAS, Section 291A of the Health and Safety Code authorizes Smith County, a political subdivision of the State of Texas (the "County"), to establish a Local Provider Participation Fund ("LPPF") from which the County may make intergovernmental transfers to finance Medicaid payments to hospitals under the Medicaid Section 1115 Waiver and other similar supplemental Medicaid payment programs; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 291A.151 of the Health and Safety Code and the County's LPPF rules and procedures adopted on March 31, 2020, the Commissioners Court wishes to assess a mandatory payment on each institutional health care provider sufficient to support Smith County and the surrounding communities' healthcare safety net and improve the availability of healthcare services in the area.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED that the Commissioners Court of Smith County authorizes Smith County to:

- 1. Assess a mandatory payment on each institutional health care provider of 6% of net patient revenue for fiscal year 2026; and
- 2. Use the funds collected through the mandatory payment for the purposes specified in Section 291A.103 of the Health and Safety Code.

WHEREAS, Barham Fulmer was born in Baytown, Texas, and spent most of his childhood on the family farm near Nacogdoches. After high school, he traveled the state for a year as the FFA State President. He studied Agricultural Economics at Texas A&M University, graduating in 1974. He was a banker for 44 years, working the last 33 years of his career in Lindale until he retired from Southside Bank in 2018; and WHEREAS, Mr. Fulmer was very active in the Nacogdoches Kiwanis Club before moving to Hideaway in 1985. He helped found the Kiwanis Club of Hideaway Lake, where he served as club president and various other roles, including as the Kiwanis Lieutenant Governor for District 34. He was auctioneer for the club's annual auction and helped raise money for scholarships and community projects; and WHEREAS, Mr. Fulmer has been very active in the Lindale Area Chamber of Commerce and has served on the board of directors. He has been a member of the Tyler Economic Development Council and served as chairman. He represented Smith County on the NET RMA Board of Directors and served multiple terms on the Lindale ISD school board, including as board president. He has also served on the board of the East Texas Area Council, Youth With A Mission Advisory Board, Hideaway Church Board, and was appointed to the Texas State Teacher Retirement Board of Directors; and WHEREAS, he has been married to his wife Linda for almost 52 years and has two children, along with his grandchildren of whom he is very proud. Since retirement he has continued to serve the community through the Kiwanis Club, Lindale Chamber, and leading a Sunday school class at his church; and WHEREAS, at the 40th Anniversary celebration of the Kiwanis Club of Hideaway-Lindale, Mr. Fulmer will be honored as founding member.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Commissioners Court of the County of Smith, Texas, through adoption of this Resolution does hereby proclaim November 2, 2025, as

"Barham Fulmer Day"

in Smith County and encourages all citizens to thank him for his dedication and service to the community.







Weather coverage from the national NEXRAD network - about 160 radars operated by the National Weather Service (NWS) - varies widely across the country. Low-level coverage is especially limited, leaving nearly 130 million Americans in low-level coverage "gaps."

Installed in the 1970s and 1980s, the federal radar network has seen little change to its footprint and is now at end-of-life. The government is focused on replacing the aging technology, but has no plans to expand the network to close existing coverage gaps - an effort that would require significant investment in new federally-owned radars. Instead, the federal government relies on commercial partners, like us, to supplement its network, offering a far more economical solution to addressing this problem.



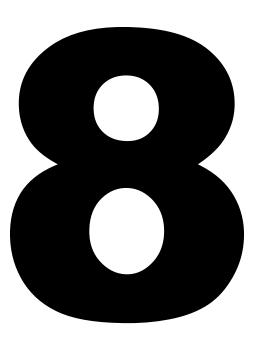
Smith County Opioid Settlement Fund Grant Program Application



All work on the county right-of-way shall be performed in accordance with the Road Administrator/Engineer's instructions. The installation shall not damage any part of the road way.

Specific instructions and conditions are as follows:

- 1. All underground lines are to be installed a minimum of 36 inches below flow line of the adjacent drainage or borrow ditch.
- 2. All buried lines carrying an electrical current, or electronic or optical signal shall have yellow plastic tape at least two inches in width, buried a minimum of twelve inches above such lines.
- 3. Lines crossing under surfaced roads and under surfaced cross roads with in the right-of-way shall be placed by boring. Boring shall extend from crown line to crown line.
- 4. All lines under roads carrying pressure in excess of 50psi shall be enclosed in satisfactory casing extending from right-of-way line to right-of-way line. Pipe used for casing may be any type approved by the Road Administrator and shall be capable of supporting the roadbed and traffic loads and shall be constructed such that there is no leakage through the casing, carrier pipe, joints or couplings. (Lines installed 48 inches or greater below flow line encasement is not required.)


- 5. No lines are to be installed under or within 50 ft. of either end of a bridge. No lines shall be placed in a culvert or within 10 ft. of the closest point of same.
- 6. Parallel lines will be installed as near the right-of-way as is possible and no parallel line will be installed in the roadbed or between the drainage ditch and roadbed without special permission of the Road Administrator/Engineer.
- 7. Overhead lines will have a minimum clearance of 18 ft. above the road surface at point of crossing.
- 8. The cost of any repairs to road surface, roadbed, structures or other right-of-way features as a result of this instillation will be borne by the owner of this line.
- 9. At least one half of the traveled portion of the road must be open to traffic at all times.
- 10. This permit is permissive, is subject to the public right of travel on and access to the right-of-way, and may not be assigned.
- 11. The applicant shall secure all other necessary or required permits, licenses, or approvals before starting work.
- 12. Signs and traffic controls shall comply with the current edition of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, as approved by the Texas Department of Transportation.
- 13. All work shall conform to the design standards and specifications of the County.
- 14. Restoration of the right-of-way is required and shall be completed within 30 days of the completed work within the right-of-way.
- 15. Right-of-Way surfaces shall be cleaned before the end of each day's work. All catch basins, culverts or other improvements affected by any deposits of dirt, mud, rock, debris, or other material shall be cleaned daily or as specified by the County.
- 16. The applicant shall provide proof of Insurance.
- 17. The applicant shall be responsible for all utility locates.
- 18. All residents or businesses affected by any scheduled maintenance causing road closure, or interruption of any utility service shall be notified forty-eight (48) hours prior to any work. Emergency situations are exempt.




